The District Agenda is comprised of five different sections:

The special meeting will begin promptly at 1:00 p.m. with the first section which is called Audience Comments on Agenda Items. The Audience Comment portion of the agenda is where individuals may comment on matters that concern the District. Each individual is limited to three (3) minutes for such comment. The Board of Supervisors or Staff is not obligated to provide a response until sufficient time for research or action is warranted. IF THE COMMENT CONCERNS A MAINTENANCE RELATED ITEM, THE ITEM WILL NEED TO BE ADDRESSED BY THE DISTRICT MANAGER OUTSIDE THE CONTEXT OF THIS MEETING. The second section is called Business Administration. The Business Administration section contains items that require the review and approval of the District Board of Supervisors as a normal course of business. The third section is called Business Items. The business items section contains items for approval by the District Board of Supervisors that may require discussion, motion and votes on an item-by-item basis. If any member of the audience would like to speak on one of the business items, they will need to register with the District Manager prior to the presentation of that agenda item. Occasionally, certain items for decision within this section are required by Florida Statute to be held as a Public Hearing. During the Public Hearing portion of the agenda item, each member of the public will be permitted to provide one comment on the issue, prior to the Board of Supervisors' discussion, motion and vote. Agendas can be reviewed by contacting the Manager's office at (850) 334-9055 at least seven days in advance of the scheduled meeting. Requests to place items on the agenda must be submitted in writing with an explanation to the District Manager at least fourteen (14) days prior to the date of the meeting. The fourth section is called Staff Reports. This section allows the District Manager, Engineer, and Attorney to update the Board of Supervisors on any pending issues that are being researched for Board action. The final section is called Supervisor Requests and Audience Comments. This is the section in which the Supervisors may request Staff to prepare certain items in an effort to meet residential needs and provides members of the audience the opportunity to comment on matters of concern to them that were not addressed during the meeting.

Public workshops sessions may be advertised and held in an effort to provide informational services. These sessions allow staff or consultants to discuss a policy or business matter in a more informal manner and allow for lengthy presentations prior to scheduling the item for approval. Typically no motions or votes are made during these sessions.

Pursuant to provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act, any person requiring special accommodations to participate in this meeting is asked to advise the District Office at (850) 334-9055, at least 48 hours before the meeting. If you are hearing or speech impaired, please contact the Florida Relay Service at 7-1-1, who can aid you in contacting the District Office.

Any person who decides to appeal any decision made by the Board with respect to any matter considered at the meeting is advised that this same person will need a record of the proceedings and that accordingly, the person may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, including the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based.

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Ratification of Acceptance of Addendum to Lake Management Agreement- The Lake Doctors

Ms. O'Mera presented the Addendum to Lake Management Agreement- The Lake Doctors to the Board to review.

On a motion by Mr. O'Connell, seconded by Mr. Hartley, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors Ratified Acceptance of Addendum to Lake Management Agreement- The Lake Doctors, for Somerset Community Development District.

#### SEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Continued Discussion and Consideration of Construction Related Damage Expenditures

General discussion ensued amongst the Board.

#### **EIGHTH ORDER OF BUSINESS**

Paver Repair at S. Castle Harbor Intersection

Mr. Dodson advised that he feels partially responsible. Mr. O'Connell previously discussed that the HOA collects for repairs and since the ABNA does, they should cover the repairs. Ms. Howard that the development put a fee in place and does not feel as though this should be denied based on not sharing funds; she stated that the road impact fee may not be sufficient to fund the HOA repairs. The Reserve Engineer has been contacted for a deeper review. At this time, the ABNA is not ready to consider sharing funds. Mr. Rosenberg proposed to split the cost 50/50. Mr. Everett stated that it is the CDD's responsibility and to add to construction traffic, service, residential and events, etc. Mr. Brown reiterated that some of the damage could very well be from construction but there is no way to know for sure. General discussion ensued regarding splitting the repair cost 50/50.

On a Motion by Mr. Rosenberg, seconded by Mr. Hartley, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors Tabled splitting the repairs cost 50/50, for Somerset Community Development District.

#### **NINTH ORDER OF BUSINESS**

#### **Manhole Repairs**

Mr. Brown provided an overview. He noted that the two manholes (is this manhole covers or the manholes? If covers, I would identify that) on S Somerset were failing. After he investigated, it was determined that it was destructive. It was discovered that the collar was in very poor structural condition. He believes the design of the structure was not built

for vehicle traffic as it has not held up. Mr. Brown put together a comprehensive stormwater system map. He counted roughly 25 manholes with the same material and design. Mr. Brown thinks the new manholes will last 30 years due to the material of the plates. Ms. Tucker suggested a steel plate as a preventative measure for construction traffic. Mr. Brown agreed this would be a very wise move to be preventative. Mr. Brown will identify which manholes will need steel plates. He will work with Alys Beach and put an exhibit together determining which manholes will need steel plates.

On a Motion by Mr. O'Connell, seconded by Mr. Rosenberg, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors approved the replacement of two manholes including any investigating costs not to exceed \$20,000.000, for Somerset Community Development District.

#### **TENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS**

## Consideration of Enhancement to Highway 30A, 4-Way Stop

Ms. O'Mera turned the discussion over to Mr. Martelli. He provided presentation of the need for additional safety feature and 4-way stop. It was always contemplated for a 4-way stop at this location. He noted that it was in the original Engineers report and recommendation for safety, security, and pedestrians to add a 4-way stop. He advised the majority of the cost would come from the County and Commissioners office to allow them to install the stop sign. The County historically has not sided with impeding the flow of traffic. He advised they need to get the technical side done and get the studies and a strategy in place. Mr. O'Connell inquired if a 4-way stop would be enough. Mr. Martelli advised that it will be good, and it slows the traffic down more than a light would. He advised we will need the community support along with politicians on board with the install to have a successful outcome. Mr. Everett had concerns regarding traffic and parking study. He debated a 4-way rather than a traffic light. Mr. O'Connell inquired on the construction cost. Ms. O'Mera informed the Board that they have not allocated money for this project.

On a Motion by Mr. O'Connell, seconded by Mr. Rosenberg, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors approved an investigation to prepare budget, including what been done do date not to exceed \$7,500.00, for Somerset Community Development District.

#### **ELEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS**

Update of Beach and Dune Restoration Feasibility Study- Monitoring, Surveys, Analysis and Report

Ms. O'Mera informed the Board that this work started later than initially planned, as there has been revisions to the scope. Tess gave an overview on the revisions. Ms. Howard asked for clarification regarding whether adding 3-way is in the budget or will they be on hold with this proposed improvement. Ms. Tucker informed her that they can not increase

the budget. She noted the District does reserve for funding on repairs as needed. Ms. Howard said that the engineer recommended to continue monitoring and to get four surveys in an 18-month period. Ms. Howard believes to see improvement and has decided to only get one survey to which she will put in the name of the CDD and the ABNA will reimburse the CDD for half of the cost. Ms. Howard said the ABNA would pay up to half the cost of four surveys.

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On a Motion by Mr. O'Connell, seconded by Mr. Hartley, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors approved MRD Associates to monitor and submit proposals not to exceed \$15,000.000, for Somerset Community Development District.

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#### TWELFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Dune Maintenance Renewal Agreement for November 2022-October 2023- Dune Doctors

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Ms. O'Mera informed the Board that this is a renewal for the Dune Doctors contract for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 which has an increase of about \$20,000.000. General discussion ensued regarding added items to contract which resulted in an increase.

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On a Motion by Mr. O'Connell, seconded by Mr. Rosenberg, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors approved Dune Maintenance Renewal Agreement for November 2022-October 2023, for Somerset Community Development District.

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#### THIRTEENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Public Hearing to Consider Adoption of the Fiscal Year 2022/2023 Budget

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On a motion by Mr. Rosenberg, seconded by Mr. Hartley, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors opened the Public Hearing, as presented for Somerset Community Development District.

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There were no public comments.

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#### **FOURTEENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS**

Presentation of Proposed Final Budget for Fiscal Year 2022/2023

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Ms. O'Mera informed the Board of some changes that will need to be addressed such as the Dune Doctors Agreement as that has just been approved. Ms. O'Mera informed the

Board that they are under funding the District Engineer line item. General discussion ensued. There were some changes to line items such as Line 45 increasing to \$32,000.00, Line 55 increasing to \$25,000.00 and Line 63 increasing to \$97,500.00.

#### FIFTEENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Resolution 2022-09, Annual Appropriations and Adopting the Budget for Fiscal Year 2022/2023

General discussion ensued regarding budgets and needing increases. Line 45- Utility Irrigation has been increased to \$32,000.00. Line 55- Palm Trees has been increased to \$25,000.00. Line 65- Dune Maintenance has been increased to \$97,500.00. Line 73-Miscellaneous Contingency has been increased to \$18,500.00.

On a Motion by Mr. O'Connell, seconded by Mr. Dodson, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors Adopted Resolution 2022-09, Annual Appropriations and Adopting the Budget for Fiscal Year 2022/2023 with the following changes to Line 45- Utility Irrigation increasing to \$32,000.00. Line 55- Palm Trees increasing to \$25,000.00. Line 65- Dune Maintenance increasing to \$97,500.00. Line 73- Miscellaneous Contingency increasing to \$18,500.00, for Somerset Community Development District.

**SECTION 1. AMENDMENT TO EXHIBIT B OF RESOLUTION 2022-10.** The Assessment Roll for Fiscal Year 2022/2023, attached to Resolution 2022-10 as Exhibit "B," is hereby replaced in its entirety with the revised assessment roll attached hereto as Exhibit A ("**Revised Assessment Roll**"). The Revised Assessment Roll is hereby certified to the County Tax Collector and shall be collected by the County Tax Collector in the same manner and time as County taxes. The proceeds therefrom shall be paid to the District.

**SECTION 2. CONFLICTS.** Except as expressly provided herein, all other provisions of Resolution 2022-10 shall be unchanged by this Resolution and shall remain in full force and effect.

#### **DISSEMINATION AGREEMENT**

Dear Sir or Madam:

Rizzetta & Company ("Rizzetta" or the "Dissemination Agent") hereby enters into this Dissemination Agreement with the Somerset Community Development District (the "District") to act as the District's Dissemination Agent. The duties of the Dissemination Agent are set forth in the Continuing Disclosure Agreement dated April 20, 2022, for the Capital Improvement Revenue Bonds, Series 2022 (the "Continuing Disclosure Agreement"). The purpose of this Agreement is to facilitate the District's compliance with the Securities and Exchange Commission's Rule 15c2-12(b)(5) (the "Rule") related to continuing disclosure. In performing its duties as Dissemination Agent, Rizzetta is acting as an independent contractor for the purpose of facilitating the District's Rules obligations and is not an agent of the District. Capitalized terms not otherwise defined herein shall have the meanings assigned to them in the Continuing Disclosure Agreement.

- 1. Duties: The Dissemination Agent shall have only such duties as are specifically set forth in the Continuing Disclosure Agreement. Both the District and Rizzetta understand that the scope of services under this Agreement and the Continuing Disclosure Agreement(s) will change as and when the District is the only remaining Obligated Person (as defined in the Continuing Disclosure Agreement) and Rizzetta will promptly notify the District upon such occurrence.
- 2. **Fees:** Rizzetta will be responsible for all out-of-pocket expenses. The annual fee for Rizzetta's service under this agreement is \$1,500 for the Series 2022 Bonds [and will be \$1,000 per year for each additional bond issuance of the District, subject to these disclosure requirements].
- 3. **Third Party Assistance:** Rizzetta reserves the right to engage a third party for the purpose of assisting Rizzetta in carrying out the services outlined in this Agreement.
- 4. **Termination:** Both the District and Rizzetta will have the right to terminate this Agreement upon sixty (60) days prior written notice.
- 5. **Representations of District:** The District represents and warrants that it will not withhold any information necessary for Rizzetta to carry out its duties under this Agreement and that it will supply all information requested by Rizzetta. The District further acknowledges and agrees that the information to be collected and disseminated by the Dissemination Agent will be produced by the District and the Developer. The Dissemination Agent's duties are those of collection, collation, and dissemination, and not of authorship or creation. Consequently,

the Dissemination Agent shall have no responsibility for the content of the information disseminated by it, except to the extent that such information was/is authored, created, or maintained by Rizzetta (to specifically exclude any information authored or produced by the Developer and/or any other third party) while under contract to provide District Management Services to the District. Compliance with all securities law liabilities, including compliance with the Rule, will remain the obligation of the District and the Developer.

- 6. **Indemnification:** To the extent permitted by law, the District will indemnify Rizzetta for any action or actions brought by Owners, as defined in the Continuing Disclosure Agreement, as a result of the failure of the District to meet any requirement of this Agreement or the Continuing Disclosure Agreement, except for any action(s) arising from Rizzetta's negligence or willful misconduct. To the extent permitted by law, Rizzetta will indemnify the District for any action or actions brought by Owners as a result of Rizzetta's gross negligence or willful misconduct, as determined by a court of competent jurisdiction.
- 7. Waiver of Jury Trial: EACH OF THE DISTRICT AND RIZZETTA KNOWLINGLY WAIVE ANY RIGHT TO TRIAL BY JURY.
- 8. **Agreement Governed by Florida Law:** The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Florida.
